Welcome to the Brighton Surf Life Saving Club

The Brighton Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) is a “not-for-profit” organisation and is registered with Incorporated Societies and the Charities Commission.

We provide an essential service to the beach going public as well as the surrounding communities of which we are a significant part of. We are affiliated to Surf Life Saving New Zealand as our parent organisation.

Brighton is a small community approximately 20 minutes’ drive south of Dunedin. It is regarded as having one of the smallest but strongest Surf Life Saving Clubs in the Southern Region and it competes with distinction at a Regional and National level.

The Brighton SLSC has over 170 members with a very strong Junior Club (under 14 years old) headed by a strong and active group of Senior Competitors in all age groups.

The Brighton beach is sheltered between Big Rock and the Brighton Domain headland and is regarded as a relatively safe beach in comparison to the more exposed city beaches. On a nice Dunedin summer’s day the Brighton beach is hard to beat and can be packed with swimmers and people using the beautiful beach. (A decent day may see about 1000 persons enjoying our beach and community).

It is a popular family beach with families coming from Dunedin and from the Taieri Plains to enjoy the rocks, scenery, sand and the surf. Brighton’s Surf Lifeguard patrols are consistently among the region’s best with high numbers and a strong focus on preventative and proactive lifeguarding resulting in a lower than average number of rescues.

Brighton Surf Life Saving Club was formed in 1937 and has a proud history of national competition success in the canoe and IRB especially.


An active recreation and sporting club for 172 members with ages ranging from 5 to our oldest member of 70+ years old.

President – Craig Dinnissen

2023-2024 President: Craig Dinnissen

I am pleased to present my report to the Club and members of the Surf Lifesaving community linked with Brighton Surf Lifesaving Club Inc, Dunedin.

As this has been my first year in the capacity of President, I wish to start by thanking the committee for their support and guidance in the role. After having served as the Club Captain in 2022-2023 season to be privileged to be nominated and supported to fulfil the role it has been hugely rewarding.

To the committee, thank you all for the tireless work you do, have done and will continue to do for the betterment of, and increased and enhanced service our club can provide its members and our beach goers, which is pleasing to see is ever increasing.

To our members, I thank you for joining Brighton Surf Lifesaving Club and supporting us in providing a service to the public, growing our lifeguarding stocks through bringing your children along to our junior sessions, sporting competitions and social events. And even getting the bug and completing Lifeguard awards to support our club. This all contributes to financially strengthening our footprint and memberships for each season and upcoming seasons. It is greatly appreciated and acknowledged in the current economic state some things are tight and unaffordable. I wish to assure you the committee understand the pressures families are facing and have taken an approach to ensure Surf club membership remains affordable, this coming year there has been a slight adjustment which has been subject to great discussion.

This previous year saw a significant fiscal package reduction in CGF across the country with on average 60% less CGF provided across the country. This has meant management of associated SLS operational costs have been tightened, but in saying that I am ecstatic to say at the end of our fiscal year we had money to spend and the club has managed to benefit through the purchase of new medical equipment such as a scoop stretcher, New Life jackets for rock work, IRB safety as well as fin belts, tubes and even a Loud Hailer to allow greater communication to beach goers.

I wish to acknowledge the support of our sponsors Heli Otago who have again provided a significant donation following a successful Brighton Gala day these funds

have also allowed new equipment for the club and you will see their name on the back of new PFD's. Colin and Ann Weatherall, and the rest of the Weatherall family, for their support through the Gala Day which provides opportunity for positive public exposure for the club as well as the ability to raise funds through gate donations and a stall site. Allied Security for their ongoing support of high visibility singlets for our members, as well as the various community funding groups such as Bendigo Trust, Otago Community Trust, the Tu Manawa Fund for providing grants to help support the purchase of new equipment for competitions and operational purposes.

To our members and competitors congratulations on a successful season from those competing at Interclubs, Regional events and National events such as Oceans 24, Senior Nationals and IRB Nationals. To your coaches, mentors, caregivers, parents and peers thank you for assisting our members with their personal achievements and development.

To our lifeguard's thank you for your volunteer hours, dedication to supporting our beach to be incident free and ensuring all beachgoers are provided a safe space to enjoy our coastline. Having a new approach to our mandatory annual refresher training for a second year has had positive effect on our skills and knowledge to provide on the beach, so I thank you all who get along get it done and make these days enjoyable. So also huge thank you to the facilitators who also organise this day it is great to see such a positive opportunity for our teams to come together.

Congratulations to our new lifeguards, rookies and patrol support members we look forward to another season of supporting you to deliver on our goal of no drownings at our beach. This actually goes further to trying the

For the 23/24 season, we were able to put together 6 patrols which covered all required weekends and patrolling Otago Anniversary and Waitangi Day. Throughout

the season within our patrols, we had 45 active lifeguards, 2 patrol support and 5 rookie guards. This season we have seen a further increase in voluntary lifeguards with 15 people completing their lifeguard award, thanks to Gabby for helping them work towards this. The number of new lifeguards is increasing in our club, and it is great to see new families joining and learning new skills to help keep the public safe.

At the start of the season, we completed a club refresher including real-world scenarios. We had a very high success rate of people who could show up to our first refresher and the others were able to complete catch-up sessions with myself, Gabby or Dave. I feel as if this is the most successful way to complete our season refreshers as people find it engaging as well as continuing to learn new things. Throughout the coming years, we wish to continue these social events to build stronger connections throughout the club and provide a safe space for people to come and hang out with friends. The support of patrols with refreshments was also appreciated by our volunteers. I would also like to thank Nevan and his Tuesday/Friday crew for all the time and effort you put into those kids to ensure they are learning new skills as well as having fun.
